Several **umbrellas** have been left behind in the foyer; with the return of the spring weather, please check in case you have left your umbrella here by mistake.


**Kia Kaha's Friends**, the Cathedral's Children's programme has returned from holiday. Children who would like to take part are invited to gather during the psalm.

Tonight, Sunday, 29th October, is the final in this year's **Theologians in the Cathedral** series. Mark Wilcox, General Manager of the NZ Anglican Pension Board will preach on *A Theological Economy: Kingdom versus Cash*, at 5pm Evensong. Following Evensong there will be a light supper and then a more in-depth presentation of the topic.

This year marks the **500th anniversary** of the start of the Reformation when Martin Luther nailed 95 Theses on the church door in Wittenburg. An ecumenical service is being held on Tuesday 31st October at 7:00pm at Knox Church, corner of Bealey Ave and Victoria St. Everyone welcome.

**All Soul's Day**, on Thursday 2 November, is a time to commemorate all of the faithful departed. Holy Eucharist at 12.05pm that day will include special prayers, and you are all invited to attend. A form is available at the back of the Cathedral this morning for the names of people that you would like to be specially remembered on that day.



# REFLECTION


E te whānau a te Karaiti, nau mai, haere mai, ki tōna ahurewa tapu. Welcome to the Transitional Cathedral, to this house of prayer and to Christ's holy table. Welcome to the broad tent with a wide open door.

At the Cathedral Evensong today we welcome the Chief Executive of the New Zealand Anglican Church Pension Board. As our preacher he will be speaking on the topic of 'A Theological Economy: Kingdom versus Cash'. Faith perspectives on money is not something that is discussed often in pulpits and places of theological discourse. However, the way the economy works is something that the biblical writers talk about a lot. Jesus himself uses a number of parables that discuss money: think of the parables of the labourers in the vineyard, the unjust steward who is forgiven much and then refuses to forgive a small amount of debt owed to him, the parable of the talents and so on. All of these parables are usually interpreted to tell us about the way the Kingdom of God works and the eternal generosity of God, but they also contain a realistic critique of the way money shapes our attitudes and our communities. Faith perspectives on money are important.

If you are interested in reading about this subject for yourself, one book I read recently is called 'An Idol Unmasked: A Faith Perspective on Money' by Bishop Peter Selby. Peter Selby wrote an earlier book on this subject called 'Grace and Mortgage' (which I have not read), which arose out of his reflections on the financial crisis of 2008. His writing examines the way money operates today based on the ability to move large amounts of it around the globe and across national boundaries. He suggests that amidst growing debt levels, money itself has become an idol that dominates our inner space and dictates society's priorities, values, and the world economy. Theological writers in this area are talking more about God's vision for the world: an economy of gifts given and received, resources shared, and the poor raised up.


