ALL SAINTS DAY

E te whānau a te Karaiti, nau mai, haere mai, ki tenei whare karakia. Welcome to the Transitional Cathedral, to this house of prayer, the broad tent with a wide open door.

Today the Cathedral is celebrating the Feast of All Saints, a day for giving thanks for those who have lived lives that have come to be seen as exemplars of the Christian faith. The old Cathedral in the Square was consecrated on All Saints Day in 1881; accordingly, this is the 136th anniversary today of the official beginning of the Christchurch Cathedral community.

It is tempting to think of the saints as the exemplars of the faith. But if we ask the question, 'Who are the saints?' the New Testament answer is that they are ordinary Christians; people like you and me. Those called 'saints' are those that the Church has recognised as people in which the image of God could be clearly seen, and therefore their stories have been remembered and we learn from their lives.

There is more to remembering the saints than recalling the good things about these people. The saints are all very human figures, filled with doubts, who often faced failure just as we do. We might be tempted to think of the saints as being highly spiritual people, spiritual wonder-women or supermen. But when we look more closely at their stories, we find that in fact they were extremely human with failings and contradictions just like the rest of us. Yet, the image of God still shone through them. In fact, the truth is that it is **because** of their humanity that we see the image of God clearly in them, and not in spite of it. And this takes us to the heart of the mystery of what it means to be in Christ. In Christ, the Word of God becomes flesh, fully human. It is in the fullness of Christ's humanity that we see the fullness of God. When it comes to being 'saintly' or holy, what we mean is that we see a person who has become like Christ. So if we want to grow in holiness, to be saintly, we need to become fully human, fully ourselves, the person God has made us to be, and we do that by seeking to grow to be more like Christ.

When we look at Christ, what we see above all is self-giving love, revealed to us in a whole human life. That means self-giving love needs to be visible in our lives too. Jesus said, blessed are the poor, blessed are the hungry, blessed are those who are persecuted for doing what is right. Being saintly means allowing our wills to be broken to the purposes of God, to focus our love beyond ourselves, to care for the hungry and the thirsty, and to be unafraid of standing with the vulnerable.

May God bless us all this week as we seek to grow in Christ and become channels of his love and grace in the world.
