

From the Dean

Dear friends,

I commend to you this season of Lent and invite you to be part of the journey of this special season. The word "Lent" comes from an old English word meaning "lengthen", referring to the lengthening days in the northern hemisphere spring. This means Lent is a time for turning toward God just as the earth turns toward the sun in the springtime. We are invited to ask, "What is God seeking to grow in you?".

In the earliest days of the Church, Lent was the time when the Church prepared people for baptism. It was a time of spiritual growth, and as the leaders of the Church taught the baptism candidates, everyone else in the Church listened again to the Word of God and renewed their commitment. The season of Lent then, is most of all about turning to God afresh, the source of love and life, and deepening our faith together.


Lent is a journey we do together as the people of God. In Lent, God calls us to support each other in the journey of faith. Helping each other to pray, to care for others and support the wider Church, to give sacrificially, and to fast. On Ash Wednesday the gospel of the day calls us into the disciplines of prayer, fasting and alms-giving. The call is to sharpen our senses and our awareness of God acting in our lives, and to encourage and build one another up in the faith.





MOVIE "A UNITED KINGDOM"

When an African prince and a white middle-class clerk from Lloyd's underwriters got married in 1948, it provoked shock in Britain and Africa. Seretse Khama met Ruth Williams while he was a student at Oxford University. After his studies, he was supposed to go home to the British Protectorate of Bechuanaland (now Botswana) and marry someone from his own tribe, but his romance with Williams changed everything. His family disapproved and Khama was forced to renounce his claim to the throne. The British government came under pressure to show its disapproval and Khama was exiled from his homeland. He later became the first president of Botswana when it became an independent country.
