Welcome to the Transitional Cathedral, the broad tent with a wide-open door. If you are a visitor to Christchurch or from one of the parishes in this Diocese, our prayer is that in our worship today you will know that the love of God is for you.

Today the Cathedral welcomes Arthur Douglas to be baptised and made a member of the Body of Christ. Once again this provides an opportunity for us all to reflect on the baptism into which we have been baptised, and the commitment we have made to be followers of Jesus. That commitment calls us to be a people who know what it is to be forgiven, and who know how to pass that forgiveness on to others. It calls us to love our neighbour as ourselves and to strive for peace and justice. Today we will all rejoice that Arthur is being baptised and we will make a commitment to share “a delight in prayer, a love for the word of God, a desire to follow the way of Christ, and food for the journey.” (NZPB page 389). Please extend a warm Cathedral welcome to Arthur, his parents Sarah and Ben, and the wider family.

On Friday your Dean went out to the airport to welcome the Choristers home from Japan. They have had a very successful overseas tour, and I am sure they will be full of stories to tell about their trip. Choral Evensongs resume this Tuesday evening at 5:30pm. At our staff meeting last Tuesday we also welcomed our new Assistant Organist, Chris Lynch, who starts this Tuesday as well. Chris has arrived here with his partner, Astrid. They have already found a flat to live in, which is great news. As the Assistant Organist role is part time, I expect they will both be looking for employment opportunities. Chris' last position was at Portland Cathedral, Oregon, USA, and I am looking forward very much to working with him. Again, please give Chris and Astrid a warm Cathedral welcome when you see them.

This means that our much-loved Harry Meehan, Assistant Organist for the last two years, will be leaving to return to Ireland at the end of this month. We will farewell Harry in due course, but please keep him your prayers in the weeks to come.

There was an article in the Christchurch Press yesterday about Anglicans disaffiliating from the Anglican Diocese of Christchurch because of the disagreement about the blessing of same-sex relationships. This Cathedral, under successive Deans, has always been a house of prayer and a safe place for all people to gather, including those from the LGBT community in same-sex relationships. Under this Dean, that welcome to all people will continue. An important principle to remember is that all who come are gathered by Christ himself, and we are all his guests. Our role is simply to co-operate with Christ's welcome and extend Christ's hospitality to everyone. I recognise that there may be some who find this painful or difficult, including those who in good conscience find themselves in disagreement with our Church on this matter. Christ's welcome is for you too, and my expectation is that your views are also to be respected in this Cathedral.
